

DYSPHORIC MILK EJECTION REFLEX (D-MER)

- Mood disturbance and unpleasant emotions felt when milk enters the breast (known as the ejection reflex)
- Dysphoric feeling diminishes as feeding progresses, then disappears between feeds

Consult a health professional for more information ,

- Can occur when :
 - Baby is at the breast (at the first ejection reflex or every time)

- Expression of milk
- Spontaneous ejection reflex
- Nipple stimulation



Good to know

• Probably due to hormonal reaction (drop in dopamine during ejection reflex)

• Although there are similarities, **D-MER** has nothing to do with :

- Post-partum depression
- Mood disorder
- Psychological aversion to breastfeeding
